Dear parents,

The children have worked so hard this year and have made so much progress. They are confident in expressing themselves. They are able to listen with attention and answer questions and they have developed their fine motor skills. We have one more month left for the children to practice these skills in preparation for FS2. Below are the topics we will be covered.

Communication, Language and Literacy:

We will revise our phonics learning and practice blending to read. Children will blend and segment sounds in simple words orally. We will collect objects that begin with the same sounds. We will talk about what we see and use questions to develop learning. We will answer a range of (who, what, where, why and how) questions.

Personal, social and emotional Development:

Children will continue to work on building their confidence and expressing themselves. Children will work on demonstrating friendly behaviour with their peers. Children will become more aware of their actions and feelings.

Physical Development:

The children will continue to practice using one-handed tools. They will practice holding the pencil correctly between their thumb and two fingers. They will practice forming letters and numbers. They will practice standing on one foot and moving freely to music.

Literacy:

This month, the children will be listening to stories about the summer holidays and traditional tales. They will discuss characters and suggest new endings to the stories. They will be retelling a sequence of events and completing various Literacy activities related to the stories.

Maths:

We will revise all the numbers 1-15 (recognition and formation). We will revise adding and taking away. Children will also revise positional language.

Understanding the world:

This month, we will be covering the topic shopping and revising the previous topics taught. We will experiment and make different crafts related to the topics. The children will learn the new vocabulary words.

Expressive art and design:

Children will use equipment and materials to achieve a planned effect, making models and collages related to the topics taught. They will also, use movement to express their feelings. They will be encouraged to make rhyming songs.
